

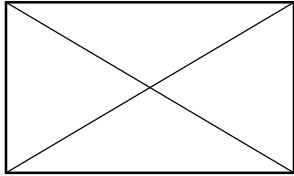

IC17 Tourist trips

- 1 A tourist is someone that visits or travels to a place for pleasure.
- 2 A heritage site is a landmark or site that is preserved because of its cultural value.
- 3 The most money on trips was spent in 2013.
- 4 The least money was spent in 2015.
- 5 R52 million – R41 million = R11 million
- 6
 - a The main reason was that the sites were too expensive. Two fifths > one third > one quarter.
 - b $\frac{2}{5} + \frac{1}{3} + \frac{1}{4} = \frac{24+20+15}{60} = \frac{59}{60}$ This does not make exactly one which is $\frac{60}{60}$.
 - c Learner response, for example: Yes, I have visited a heritage site on a school outing.

IC18 Flying shapes

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- 2 No, a triangle cannot have a diagonal.
- 3 If we turn a shape at an angle, we get a sense of movement.
- 4 A picture that emphasizes the diagonal in colour, shape or light gives a sense of movement.
- 5 Learner response. In this example the leaves are not geometric shapes though.
